INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. Page BD-6: After Article '1.16 SUBSTITUTIONS:', add the following article:

"1.17 PURCHASE OF AMERICAN STEEL OR FOUNDRY PRODUCTS:

- A. The laws of the State of Indiana (IC 5-16-8 as amended) require that only steel or foundry products made in the United States are to be used on public works projects. In accordance with IC 5-16-8-2(b) and IC 5-16-8-4, the following two exceptions may allow the use of foreign steel or foundry products on projects accomplished by Purdue University.

1. Unreasonable Pricing

- a. The price of any steel or foundry products of domestic origin is not considered unreasonable if the price does not exceed the sum of:
 - 1) The price of steel or foundry products of foreign origin (including any applicable duty); plus
 - 2) A differential of fifteen percent (15%) of the price of the steel or foundry products of foreign origin.
- b. The comparison of price will be of materials meeting all requirements identified in the Bidding Documents. The price comparison will be the sum of all steel or foundry products to be included in Bidder's bid and products include, but are not limited to: structural steel, miscellaneous steel, duct work, pipe and pipe fittings, conduit and conduit fittings, electrical boxes, nuts, bolts, fasteners, and steel stud framing. For consideration of foreign steel based upon unreasonable pricing, Bidder shall provide supporting pricing documentation from at least three manufacturers, not vendors, of the steel and foundry products to be used on the project which demonstrate that the price of domestic steel products may be considered unreasonable, as defined above.
- c. Bidder shall include its request for a waiver of the American steel or foundry product with its Subcontractor and Material Questionnaire and Bidder's failure to timely do so shall constitute an irrevocable waiver of any right to seek a determination based upon unreasonable pricing of domestic steel.

2. Unavailability

- a. For consideration under the availability of steel or foundry products, Bidder shall provide supporting documentation from at least three manufacturers, not vendors, certifying that one or more particular steel or foundry products required by the Bidding Documents are not available in sufficient supply to meet the requirements of the project."
